## Samot-Sari ni Ka June

Alam ba ninyo na..... (*Did you know that*...) Marami tayong mga kababayang imbentor: (*We have many Pinoy inventors*...)

Ang **erythromycin** ay isang gamot na "macrolide antibiotic", na maaring alternatibo sa penicillin. Ito ay naimbento ni **Abelardo Aguilar**, isang tagapagbigay ng pangangalagang pangkalusugan, na nakapansin na ang Aspergillus ay may kapangyarihang patayin ang mga bakterya sa isang bayan sa Iloilo. Ipinakita ni Abelardo ang Aspergillus sa

kanyang kumpanyang Eli Lillyco na tumulong na ito ay maging isang kilalang gamot na tinawag na Ilosone, upang pasinayaan ang bayan na pinanggalingan nito, Iloilo.



A macrolide antibiotic that

was offered as an alternative choice to penicillin. This was found by Abelardo Aguilar, a health care provider who noticed the antibacterial actions of the Aspergillus species of fungi in his hometownin Iloilo. He then dispatched samples to his employer, Eli Lilly Co. The antibacterial motion was additionally developed by the Indiana-based company which marketed the antibiotic below the brand name Ilosone, in honor of the place it was found.

Ang **yo-yo** ay isang Ilokano pararila na nagmumungkahi ng "pagbabalik". Noong unang panahon, ito ay sandata na ginagamit ng mga katutubo 400 na taon na ang nakalipas. Si **Pedro Flores** ang nag imbento ng gawa sa kahoy na may pisi na laruan. Sa ngayon ang yoyo ay nilalaro ng maraming tao sa mundo.

The phrase yo-yo is an Ilocano phrase that suggests "come back". It was a weapon that had been utilized by natives for 400 years. It was additionally hooked up to thick 20-feet long ropes for

flinging at enemies or prey. The modern model was designed by a legislation undergraduate named, Pedro Flores. It was fabricated from lighter supplies (wooden and cotton stings) and was mass-produced within the United States. **June Sustento-Reyla** 

Si **Dr. Fe del Mundo** isang dalubhasa sa pag gamot ng bata ay imbento ng "**Medical Incubator**," gawa sa basket na iba't ibang hugis at laki. Mga maiinit na tubig bote ang nakalagay dito upang magsilbing init sa loob ng basket. Mayroon itong takip upang mapanatili ang oxygen sa loob ng basket. Ito ay ginawa upang matugunan ang pangangailangan ng mga bagong silang na sanggol sa mga liblib na pook ng bansa na salat sa elektresidad.

An improvised medical incubator was invented by pediatrician Fe del Mundo. This was made up of two native laundry baskets of various sizes positioned one inside the opposite. Hot water bottles have been positioned throughout between them to offer heat. There was additionally a makeshift hood over the overlapping baskets to permit oxygen to flow the inside. It was created to deal with the wants of rural areas with no electrical energy that's wanted to control new child infants' body temperature.

boligrapo, hindi kumukupas at hindi rin kumakalat. Isa ito sa pinaka perpektong tinta na naimbento sa ating

bagong panahon. Ang tinta ay may apat kulay, itim, luntian, pula at asul.

# **Philippine Outreach Experiences 2023**

On January 2023, I, once again ventured into my outreach project in the Philippines. First was Bahay Aruga in Malate, Manila, where I met 15 children afflicted with cancer. We were introduced to the children by the manager of the house. The children stay in this house for free as they go to Philippine General Hospital for their cancer treatment, chemotherapy or consultation with their oncologists; they came to Manila for a better treatment in this famous hospital and Bahay Aruga is a place that help them for their accommodation for free while receiving treatment from PGH. I distributed grocery bags, some school supplies, and books, including bed linens, and they were very happy to receive them.

Two weeks later, I visited the street children of Malolos in Barangay San Gabriel, Bulacan. Many of these children beg in the streets for food. My contact person, Tess Delgado, take the pains of gathering these children twice a week to teach them moral values and catechism. We were able to set up a mini library where the kids find time to browse the donated books and spend their time in this mini library instead of roaming around the streets of Malolos. The book shelves and books were all donations from kind-hearted people, especially FAAV including childrens' clothes and shoes. The children look forward to these goodies every time they find out that I have arrived home to the Philippines.

Towards the end of February, 2023 I ventured into another outreach and I travelled to Orani, Bataan to visit the Aetas, one of our indigenous group of people in the Philippines. It was an arduous task of bagging rice, cooking chicken and rice, making sandwiches and repacking grocery bags for 100 adults and children. My grandkids, son and daughter-in-law packed the car with all these goodies including clothes, slippers, groceries and bags of rice, plus the food that we prepared the night before. We started to get ready at 3:00 in the morning and by 6 am we were ready to travel. We reached Orani at 9 in the morning and the Aeta kids were already lined up. Our contact people have organized the Aeta community very well before we arrived. It was a very touching moment, to see all these people full of excitement and enthusiasm. The Aeta children and mothers were so proud to show off their dance and songs.

It was a very touching experience to share what we have to the less fortunate ones. Thank you, FAAV for sharing, and to all the others who find time to share God's blessings.

## Samot-Sari ni Ka June (continued)

The Quink fast-drying ink' was invented by Francisco Quisumbing, a chemist. It was an innovative ink at the moment and was additionally developed to work with Parker Pens. Aside from being fast drying, it was additionally water resistant, didn't clog the pen opening, doesn't blot, and won't fade. It was manufactured in 4 colors – black, green, red and blue. It is taken into account as one of the perfect promoting ink for fountain pens of the millennium.



Ang "**spike game**" ay isang pamamaraan ng paglalaro ng "volley ball" na na imbento ng mga Pinoy ngayon siglo dalawampu at nakilala sa pangalang "**Manila Bomb**".

The "spike game" is a volleyball approach developed by Filipino gamers within the first half of the 20th century and was often known as the "Manila Bomb".

Dahilan sa ang Pinoy ay kinilala sa pagiging mahiligin sa musika, si **Roberto del Rosario** ang nag imbento ng tinatawag na "**sing-along**". Ang pangalang karaoke ay nagmula sa Hapon, na ang ibig sabihin ay pag awit kasaliw ng musika na walang boses. Sa ngayon, ang karaoke ay popular na sa buong mundo.

The musical inclination of Pinoys has spurred Roberto del Rosario to invent the karaoke sing-along system. Karaoke derives from Japan and suggests singing alongside a popular document with its unique vocals eliminated.



### **June Sustento-Reyla**

Ang "**jeepney**" ang hari ng kalye ng Pilipinas. Ito ay inimbento ng mga Pinoy, nagmula sa hukbong sandatahan ng Estados Unidos, nang lumisan ang mga

Amerikano sa Pilipinas matapos ang digmaan. Ang mga naiwang sasakyang ito ay ginawang sasakyan pampasahero ng mga Pinoy, isang mahalagang imbensyon. Ito ay ginawan ng bakal na bubong, at makulay



na disenyo upang maging kaibig ibig sa paningin ng masang Filipino. Ito ang nagsilbing murang pamamaraan ng transportasyon sa masang Filipino sa kabila ng mga malubak na kalsada.

Jeepneys are the king of the Philippine roads. It was created by Filipinos from the US army jeeps after the Americans left the nation after the struggle. These surplus jeeps are stripped down and made longer to accommodate a number of passengers on the back, Filipino inventions. Metal roofs present shade to the passengers whereas colorful decorations adorn it inside and outside. It offered reasonably priced transportation that may transfer in regards to the bumpy roads that paved the post-war Philippines.

The Moon Buggy was invented in 1968 by Eduardo San Juan. He was the project leader for NASA in the buggy development: An underfunded and underappreciated engineering success. Eduardo San Juan was known as Space Junkman.

## **Philippine Consular Outreach**

The Philippine Consulate General in San Francisco led by Consul Jed Llona organized a Consular Outreach Mission in Tigard, Oregon from April 21 to 23, 2023 at the Double Tree by Hilton Hotel, providing a total of 950 services to our kababayans.

The consular outreach afforded Filipinos and Filipino Americans passport, dual citizenship, and overseas voting registration services without having to travel to San Francisco. Applicants from throughout Oregon and other states, including Alaska, California, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Washington, among others, availed of services during the outreach.

The outreach was held with the support of Philippine Honorary Consul in Oregon Enrico D. Tadeo, assisted and coordinated by Philippine Chamber of Commerce of Oregon (PACCO), and Filipino American Association of Vancouver WA (FAAV). Different Fil-Am associations in the area and other community leaders also participated in terms of volunteer time and food donations.

PACCO and FAAV would like to thank all volunteers and multiple Fil-Am organizations for all the hours of work, dedication, help and support given to our Filipino community, especially despite staying outside in the cold weather for some of them.

We do hope that this community effort will spur on camaraderie and friendships among the volunteers that will go on through the coming years.
